### ***Reminder..... Skeet Clinic This March***

March is just around the corner, and so is the highly regarded DCF&S Beginners Skeet Clinic, hosted by Barry Greenberg and a dedicated group of experienced shooter instructors. The four week course, held 4 Saturday's in March, is designed to help shooters unfamiliar with the basic fundamentals of skeet shooting. The classes cover all aspects of the game, including gun safety, etiquette on the field, and of course, shooting instruction.

The complete course encompasses the first four Saturdays in March, the 3rd, 10th, 17th, and 24th. Classes begin promptly at 8am, and end at 12 noon. It is limited to 15 shooters. The entire cost of the 4 week

program is \$65.00, not including ammunition. We would appreciate if only those able to attend all four Saturday classes enroll. A complete list of all equipment needed during the four weeks of this clinic will be sent to you upon enrollment. It is highly recommended that only 12 or 20 gauge semi-automatics or over and under shotguns, with skeet or improved chokes be used for this course.

#### ***High Power***

On Sunday Feb. 12th thru March 11th (5 weeks) the High Power Range will host it's annual "Bolt Gun League". The course of fire will be 100 rounds (20 per week) offhand @ 100 yards using the 100 yard small-

bore targets. Rifles will be of the standard high power Silhouette rules (6mm & above). Shooting will be from 9am to 12 noon & the cost of the league will be \$15.00 for all 5 weeks.

## ***Junior Perspective***

### Table Trap

For my second article I stopped by the Table Trap range where I worked with CRO Tom O'Chuida and ROs Jean and Bill Young to learn about shotguns and have some fun on a cold January morning. I don't have a lot of experience shooting shotguns. I use one mainly in Cowboy Action™ shooting where I've shot a 410 and a 12 ga side-by-side with the 12 ga shooting reduced loads my father loads for me. I've also had several chances to shoot a 20 ga pump action to hunt pheasants but that's about all so I was sure that I would be learning something new today.

It was a Sunday morning and I met Mr. O'Chuida in the club house and we waited for 12-noon, the time the Table Trap range opens on Sundays. It was a cold winter morning so I dressed for the temperature. I put on a winter coat and an insulated vest under the coat to keep my body warm without being too bulky to prevent my arms from moving easy. I added a hat and I was ready for the outdoors. With my coat, hat, 410 and shells Mr. O'Chuida and I walked out to the range just after noon where we met up with Jean and Bill.

Table Trap is a manually operated shotgun range where a machine uses a spring to throw clay birds up into the air so they can be shot, and more importantly hit. The machines are intended to use with two people, as shooter and an operator. The springs are color coded to tell you how fast they will throw the clay birds. The yellow spring is the slowest, then the blue and the red is the fastest. First time shooters should start on the yellow machines.

The shooter stands in a box to the left of the machine. The second person loads one or two clay birds, singles or doubles, then pulls the release when the shooter calls

for the bird by saying something like, PULL! To use the range you bring your shotgun, shells and a box of clay birds and the club provides the machine. If you don't own a shotgun the club has some that can be made available through a Range Officer so you can give it a try before spending money. You will need to use factory shells in the club guns, no reloads.

When we got to the range Mr. O'Chuida, Jean and Bill had a few other shotguns for me to try, a 20 and a 28 ga semi-automatic. I was interested to see if I could feel a difference in shooting each. I started with my 410 ga using a machine with a yellow spring. The 410 didn't kick much at all but I was only able to shoot 5 birds out of the 10 thrown. Next I moved to the 20 ga and shot a machine with a blue spring. The 20 ga had the largest kick out of the three guns but it wasn't bad. I was able to shoot 4 birds out of 8 that were thrown. Last I gave the 28 ga a try. Hardly any kick at all. I was able to hit 2 of the 3 birds thrown from a blue machine and 2 for 2 on a red machine. I liked the 28 ga the most. It seemed to have plenty of reach with little kick and it felt good to shoot.

I hope my dad will buy me one soon.... wink.... wink....

I will certainly be back to Table Trap. If you think this is something you'd like to try the scheduled matches begin in March. If you want to find out more or just give it a try before shooting a match there are Range Officer available almost every Sunday to explain how to use the equipment and to help show you what to do. I had a great time shooting table trap and I'd like to thank Mr. O'Chuida, Jean and Bill for taking time to work with me. Until next month this is Chelsea MacCain with the *JUNIOR PERSPECTIVE*.

## ***This Month's Featured Range...***

*FEATURED RANGE highlights a different range each month to help our members become more familiar with what is offered by our club.*

### **High Power Range – More is Happening Than You Might Think**

If you asked most DCF&S members about the high power range, many might think that the range sees most if not all of its activity in the weeks preceding whitetail season with hunters sighting in their deer rifles or slug guns. While that may have been the case in the past, over the past two years, the high power range has seen the addition of several new monthly matches and leagues. In fact, there are no less than twenty leagues and matches scheduled for 2012 at the high power range. Indeed, while we still have a lot of members who only use the range to sight in their hunting rifles, the types of rifles, shooters and activities that you see on the high power range today are much more diverse than what you would have seen twenty, ten and even five years ago.

By the time you read this, we will probably be in the midst of our Military Service Rifle League which runs every Sunday morning through February 5<sup>th</sup>. For nearly thirty years, this league was limited to M1 Garand rifles. While there is certainly nothing wrong with the Garand (you can still expect to see several of them on the line), last year CRO Ed Hilliard decided to open the league up to all military service rifles chambered in a caliber of 6mm or larger. This was done in order to get more shooters to participate in the league. League participants take 100 record shots over a five week period (usually 20 shots per week) at 100 yard Smallbore targets from the offhand (standing) position. If you have a military service rifle (iron sights only, no glass or red dots) and would like to participate in the league, please stop by the high power range any Sunday AM through February 5<sup>th</sup> and sign up.

After we wrap-up the Military Service Rifle league, we will begin our annual "Bolt Gun" league which runs Sunday mornings from February 12<sup>th</sup> through March 11<sup>th</sup>. In this league, shooters can use any high powered rifle chambered in a caliber of 6mm or larger. Scopes are allowed (most shooters use them). Again, participants take 100 record shots over a 5 week period from the offhand position.

After the Bolt Gun league wraps up, we move-on to the "Lever Gun" league, which was introduced two years ago. Here, shooters take 100 record shots from the offhand position using any centerfire lever-action rifle with iron or aperture sights (no scopes). This league

runs on Sunday mornings from March 18<sup>th</sup> through April 15<sup>th</sup>.

With respect to all three of the aforementioned leagues, shooters who are not able to shoot their record shots on any particular Sunday may shoot ahead or make them up on a later Sunday. However, all record shots must be taken by the last day of each league. Therefore, don't let the fact that you just found out about our rifle leagues discourage you from participating, since you can take 40, 60, 80 or even 100 shots on a Sunday to get all of your shots in.

April marks the end of League season but also ushers in our Saturday and Sunday monthly match season. Two years ago, the High Power range staff spent a considerable amount of time and effort in constructing a first-class smallbore silhouette range. We will be running our smallbore silhouette matches on the following mornings (all Saturdays): 4/28, 5/26, 6/23, 7/28, 8/25 and 9/22. Please note that the high power and black powder ranges are closed to all other shooters during our smallbore matches (we have target setters running downrange every five minutes so we close the bench positions for safety reasons) so if you plan on coming out on a Saturday morning, please check to make sure that the range is open. If you've never shot a silhouette match before you should stop by and try it out. Even if you don't have a .22 rifle don't let that hold you back. Most shooters will be glad to lend you theirs for the match. The course of fire involves shooting at 40 steel silhouette animals (chickens, pigs, turkeys and rams) at distances of 40, 60, 77 and 100 yards.

But the fun doesn't stop there. We will also be running several "three gun" matches again this year. A "three gun" match consists of three stages: Shotgun, Pistol and Rifle. The shotgun stage consists of taking 8 shots with a pump-action shotgun at steel plates placed at about 20 yards. Then the shooter takes 20 shots with a semi-automatic handgun at steel plates placed at about 30 feet (you'll need four magazines for your pistol and only cast bullets may be used). Finally, the shooter will take eight shots with a rifle at bowling pins placed at 100 yards. The shotgun and pistol stages are timed, and each miss or procedural error adds five seconds to your time. Each

hit with the rifle takes five seconds off. The shooter with the lowest overall time wins.

On May 13 and November 11, we will hold “WWII Era Combat Shoots” in which participants will use WWII era shotguns, semi-automatic handguns (i.e. 1911-A1, Luger, P-38) and rifles (M1 Garand or Carbine, 1903-A3, Mosin-Nagant, 98K Mauser, etc.).

On August 12, we will hold a Three Gun Action Match in which shooters can use just about any combination of semi-automatic shotgun, semi-automatic handgun and rifle.

On October 14 we will hold a “Vietnam Era Combat Shoot” where participants use shotguns, handguns and rifles from the Vietnam War era (AR15's, SKS, AK47, M14, etc.).

Our final three gun match this year will be held on December 9. It is a “Wild Bunch Shoot” in which participants use a pump-action shotgun, 1911 handgun (but you can only use one hand to hold it!) and a 1903-A3 rifle (the club has a rifle that any shooter can use in the match).

As is the case with all of our matches, if you don't have a required firearm, please don't let that stop you from participating, as many shooters will gladly lend you their shotgun, rifle and/or pistol, although some might get upset if you beat their score.

Our most popular matches tend to be “bench rest” type matches where the shooter takes their shots from the bench. We have three bench matches scheduled this year: an I.B.S. Benchrest Target Match which will be held on June 10<sup>th</sup>, a “Groundhog Shoot” (probably our most popular match) which will be held on July 8<sup>th</sup>, and a Bench Rest match which will be held on September 9. Please note that you don't need a super tricked-out bench rest rifle to shoot in these matches. We have classes for iron sights, rimfire (heavy barrel and hunter class), centerfire (heavy barrel and hunter class), bench rest rifle and junior classes.

Finally, we will also be holding three “rimfire action matches” which we started to hold this past year. These are a “three gun” type match but the shooters only use .22cal rimfire firearms. The course of fire consists of 20 shots taken with a semi-automatic handgun at steel plates placed at about 30 feet, 20 shots taken with a semi-automatic rifle taken at steel plates placed at 50 yards, and 8 shots with a rifle (bolt or semi-auto) taken at bowling pins placed at 100 yards. The handgun and

semi-automatic rifle stages are timed, with each miss costing the shooter 5 seconds, and with each rifle hit taking 5 seconds off of their final score.

If you're interested in participating in any of our matches/leagues but have never shot competitively before, please don't be intimidated. Stop by the high power range during one of our matches and observe what's going on, ask questions, meet the shooters, etc. I'm sure that you will find that we are a very friendly bunch and that you will want to get involved. This isn't Camp Perry and nobody expects you to shoot master-class here. Our main goal is to get people active in the shooting sports in a safe, fun, and friendly environment.

It should also be noted that DCF&S is affiliated with the Civilian Marksmanship Program ([www.thecmp.org](http://www.thecmp.org)). If you've ever wanted to buy a genuine USGI M1 Garand rifle (they also offer M1 Carbines, 1903, 1917 and Krag rifles too from time to time), the CMP is one of the best places to get one at a good price. Participating in any of our matches will satisfy the CMP's marksmanship requirement which is a prerequisite to purchasing an M1 Garand or other U.S. military rifle from them. Perhaps we'll see you on the line with one in one of our matches or leagues.

Finally, I'd like to point out that the high power range has a staff of at least six range officers who dedicate much of their free time to maintaining the range and making it run in a safe and smooth manner. We ask that you (1) act in a safe, responsible manner while shooting on the range, that you (2) police your brass and dispose of it in the brass buckets that abut each shooting position, and that you (3) pull your target off of the backer when you are done shooting.

Range officers can be found on the high power range most weekends and holidays. While we are primarily there to ensure compliance with the range's safety rules and to run matches, we are also there to assist shooters who might need assistance with getting a new rifle on-paper, etc. We keep a bore sighter in the office along with other necessary equipment that shooters might sometimes forget to bring with them such as sandbags; rests; staplers; targets and a spotting scope which members can use while a range officer is present. We can also answer questions regarding range safety rules; match rules and general firearms questions. If you are unsure about a particular rule, or if you're on the range and see what you think is an unsafe condition, you should feel free to ask or report the condition to a range officer. Obviously, safety is of the utmost importance at DCF&S so all members are empowered to enforce the

rules of our ranges. Therefore, even if a range officer is not present, you must address safety problems if and when you see them, but please try to act in a non-confrontational manner, as many of our members are not entirely familiar with safe firearms handling rules, since many may be novice shooters. Simply pointing out their actions to them and their potential consequences should be enough, but if you should ever happen to come across a member or guest who refuses to co-operate, we would ask that you simply report their actions to a range officer or the front office who will take-over the matter.

We all very-much enjoy the club's facilities and we want our members to enjoy their experience on our range, so any suggestions you have to make your experience at the high power range more pleasant should be brought to our attention. Please don't hesitate to communicate your feelings to a range officer or to write them down and drop them into the suggestion box at the club headquarters.

***A Recipe to Share.... Venison with Sautéed Onions and Garlic***

What you will need:

Venison

Garlic clove

Olive oil

Mushrooms

Onion

“Better than bouillon” and water

Broil venison tenderloins or back straps until pink inside or to your preference

Dice a clove of garlic and cut mushrooms and onions to desired size

Sautee' diced garlic, mushrooms and onions in a skillet with olive oil until the onions become clear

In a separate pan mix “ Better than bouillon” and water per the directions and bring to a simmer

Add bullion broth to skillet with vegetables

Cut the meat into bite-sized pieces and add them to broth and vegetables

Simmer a few minutes but be careful not to over cook the meat
